

WORLD ALMANAC FOR KIDS

Brief Description

In this lesson the students will learn about the World Almanac, what types of information it includes, how it is organized, and how to find information which answers questions on various topics.

Students will understand that:

- The WORLD ALMANAC is a book of **current** facts and statistics.
- The WORLD ALMANAC is published annually (meaning once a year).
- The WORLD ALMANAC is a reference material used to quickly find brief facts and statistics.
- The WORLD ALMANAC using lists, tables, and graphs to give information.

Skills:

- Students will use the table of contents or index of the WORLD ALMANAC FOR KIDS to find what page/s they can find information they are seeking.
- Students will use scanning or skimming reading skills to locate information they need, then read for content.
- Students will work on teams to find answers to questions by locating information in the Almanac.

LESSON 1:

Almanac Overview on the Smart Board - TOC, organization, pages from several sections. Ask and answer questions using pages scanned.

LESSON 2:

Students will work in groups of three. Each group will receive several pages from different sections of the Almanac. Each group will write down answers to questions noting section and page number used to answer the question.
